#### **New! Encouraging News to Share!**

At the recent meeting of the Finance Committee, our devoted treasurer, Darren Johnson, and financial secretary, Warren Shaedle, reported encouraging news that highlights the rising generosity of the members and friends of our

church. Darren presented a 2020 Finance-Year-in-Review through the "Fund Balance Report" we're required to submit each year to the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference of The UMC. In that report, \$393,670 was received last year from congregational and other resources. The church disbursed \$350,900 to administrative and operational accounts like conference and general church apportionments, salaries, materials, building, and other church life expenses. We also received and disbursed \$16,225 in additional benevolence money to help people in need in our community and beyond. Darren further reports that our fund balance at the end of January is \$62,440, a healthy picture at the beginning of a new year still in a pandemic emergency. For all the generous giving, Thank You! God Bless You! Keep up the Generosity!

A fund balance from 2020 receipts of \$42,700 was carried over into 2021. All bills owed in 2020 to various vendors, creditors, and others were paid in full. We did not, however, pay the full apportionments to the conference (connectional ministries fund) or to the general church (general church fund). Joyfully, we did remit 100% of the apportionment to the World Service Fund, the missions arm of the Church. As we advance in 2021 and 2022, LUMC has been approved for a \$14,000 (connectional ministries fund) apportionment reduction over two years (\$7,000 each year). We owe thanks to the new district superintendent, Dr. Andrew Foster, for his help in providing some temporary financial relief.

Warren gave a review of the results of the financial commitments for 2021. There, too, the news is encouraging. Make no mistake, the church remains in risky financial shape, but we're holding on by the grace of God and your generosity. The news: 28 pledges remain the same as last year (Good!); 15 pledges increased

over last year (Wonderful! Remarkable!); 8 pledges are less or giving what they can (Faithful!). Recent deaths, job losses, and relocations remove nearly \$30,000 over last year. Our prayers are sent with love to all! Overall: Slightly less pledged (-1.2%), but more pledges than last year(!) and pledges fund a higher percentage of the budget this year at 51%(!) (v.47% in 2020) and the 2021 shortfall to fund the entire budget is less than 2020 by \$4,200(!) Praise God from whom all blessings flow!




#### **Conversations on Race**



Covid-19 Impact Fund Is Making a Difference Sometimes, simply making a difference is all that's needed. The Covid-19 Impact Fund has been doing just that! Reaching about \$15,000 at its start, we've distributed over \$4,400 to pay 7

rents, make 1 car repair, buy 1 bundle of groceries, help one person get current with their electric bill, help one person get current with their health insurance premiums, and partner with another UMC to provide Christmas presents for 2 families. We are working with several churches in the borough as well as Manna on Main to share the interviewing of those in need and the cost associated with helping. It's been a rewarding experience. In addition to the congregational and community care, we've also paid to buy PPE to return to worship safely at the right time, and pay for costs associated with the LiveStream broadcasts on Sunday mornings.

# Return to In-Person Worship Continues On Hold!

Grace and peace to the people of LUMC:
My prayers are always with you. I pray for your
health and wellness. I pray for your everdeepening relationship with God the Father, God

the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. It's wise to review from time to time where we are at LUMC relative to the pandemic emergency and a return to in-person worship. Our church's "Phased Reopening Guidelines" were approved last June and are in play today. You can read the guidelines when you click here. The guidelines obligate LUMC to follow the directives of the CDC and the Commonwealth. Currently, Montgomery County is in a "red zone" as defined by the directives. Red zones have more than 100 new cases per 100,000 residents and a diagnostic test positivity result of above 10 percent. Lansdale's test positivity rate is 10.23% as of January 11. The red zone restricts gatherings. Therefore, keeping in-person worship on hold based on the numbers and our own guidelines is in order. Remember, every Thursday, a Covid-19 alert is updated and published in the eCR (at the bottom) and in the bulletin that's mailed bi-weekly to congregants who are not online. The bulletin is also uploaded onto the website under the worship section at the Sunday Bulletins subsection. In that update, case numbers and positivity rates in the Commonwealth and Montgomery County are reported. We'll publish the weekly update on the website banner for easier access for those comfortable with technology. Since the vaccine rollout is slow, it's impractical to speculate on when we'll return to anything that looks "normal" on Sunday mornings. As you no doubt know, vaccinations for Covid-19 are slowly being distributed. Higher vaccination rates will be helpful in the long run.

Please get your vaccination when it's available to you! Once we see how vaccinations are progressing within the congregation, we'll look to returning to inperson worship. Remember, it's still unclear if vaccinated people can carry and transmit the virus. Vaccination is not a cure-all, but it is a very positive and hopeful sign. We can all understand and sympathize with the loss and pain Covid-19 is causing the church. We long to be with each other. We also need to protect the congregation. As the church's pastor, along with its leaders, we take the responsibility to do that. Following the Covid-19 Phased Reopening Guidelines of LUMC is the way to go forward for the time being. Your responses and questions are welcome.

# UPDATED! - COVID-19 STATUS - NEW! County Cases Flattening!

On **Tuesday**, **February 9th**, Montco's rate of new coronavirus cases inched up to 202 per 100,000 residents, but still an overall 12% drop over the last 14 days. The decline is holding and encouraging. The test positivity rate is at 8%, slightly higher than the recommended minimum rate of 5%. At this level, the county is still at very high risk based on per capita cases and test positivity. Caution is wise. The British variant of Covid-19 is reported in the county as of January 28th. LUMC will remain in its current status of restricted opening for LiveStream worship and other approved uses. The numbers are moving in the right direction! Vaccinations will help us!
