### March 28th is Palm-Passion Sunday!

Lent's journey reaches its sixth stop in Jerusalem for the solemn remembrance of his entry into the Holy City and his Passion on the cross. We'll look at Mark's account of Jesus' death and burial, very intimate moments in a human being's life. Mark's version takes

a deep breath and looks back over the scenes of the day. Evening falls, and the moon is full and bright. The afternoon's unholy darkness gives way to twilight, and all seems to return to normal. A godly man named Joseph, from the town of Arimathea, makes a risky move and asks for the body of Christ, which is granted to him. He has a new tomb waiting to receive the Messiah. Joseph is the one who buys a linen shroud, washes the body of Jesus, shrouds it, and lays it in the tomb before sealing it with a stone. All activities had to be completed before the day's end. The women with Jesus at the crucifixion are with him again in mourning as the tomb is sealed. His body's complete preparation for its long sleep isn't possible, but the women see where Jesus' corpse lies in repose. They tuck the location in their hearts, planning to return and complete their loving task. As we approach Holy Week and Easter, let's be aware of God's reconciling love that's still at work today, healing the sick, comforting the dying, feeding the soul, and walking with the forgotten.

Covid-19 Impact Fund Is Making a Difference Sometimes, simply making a difference is all that's needed. The Covid-19 Impact Fund has been doing just that! Reaching about \$15,000 at its start, we've distributed over \$5,200 to pay 10 rents, make 1 car

repair, buy 1 bundle of groceries, help one person get current with their electric bill, help one person get current with their health insurance premiums, and partner with another UMC to provide Christmas presents for 2 families. We are working with

several churches in the borough as well as Manna on Main to share the interviewing of those in need and the cost associated with helping. It's been a rewarding experience. In addition to the congregational and community care, we've also paid to buy PPE to return to worship safely at the right time, and pay for costs associated with the LiveStream broadcasts on Sunday mornings.

#### **UPDATED!** – **COVID-19 STATUS** – **NEW!**

#### A Call to Caution and Vaccination!

As of today, **Thursday, March 25**, the daily report on the case count in Montco is 277 per 100,000 residents. The optimal goal is fewer than 100 cases reported within a 14-day period. We're not quite there yet. Currently, Montco's case count is on a plateau, which is not the best news. According to CDC guidelines, the county remains in the **very high risk** category at current levels. The White House Coronavirus Task Force, the Commonwealth, and county health authorities rank Montco at the same level. The test positivity rate is holding at 5%, which suggests that cases are undercounted. Vaccinations are proceeding, which is genuinely **great news**!

Vaccinations will get us back to in-person worship in the quickest way. Please consider prayerfully receiving one of the safe and effective vaccines. For the time being, caution is the wisest course of action. LUMC will remain in its current status of limited openings for LiveStream worship and other approved uses. Let your prayers flow for the many who are suffering, hospitalized, and for those who have died and for those grieving their losses.
