Lent Continues!

As we journey to the third stop on the Lenten path, the Third Sunday in Lent, the theme of *The Gethsemane Press* greets us with a message for the season during the LiveStream service at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday. We'll examine Mark's account of Jesus' time spent in Gethsemane. We think of that word and associate a garden with it. Gethsemane is the Hebrew word for "oil press." Olives were brought to the "garden" for pressing, squeezing, crushing. It's not a coincidence that Jesus was there with the same three inductees into the new kinship--Peter, James, and John-- who were on the mountaintop when the Transfiguration occurred. It was while they were coming down from the mountain that the weight of the passion began to press in on Jesus, and his inner circle. These were the four who had experienced a wonderful and glorious vision. Now they were together again at a very vulnerable moment in Jesus' life. In the same place where olives were pressed and crushed, Jesus entered into a time of prayer with the crushing weight of impending death on him. As we approach the midpoint of the holy season in Lent, let's be aware on the way life is crushing down on so many people for so many reasons. And let's open our hearts to the merciful heart of Jesus to find comfort.

On July 1, 2021, Lansdale UMC will welcome our new pastor, Steward Warner from Salem UMC in Orwigsburg, PA. Pastor Warner began serving Salem UMC on July 1, 2015. He is an ordained

He founded Non-Violence week and developed a Day Camp for children in the city of Reading. He has also served on several community boards and is a graduate of Leadership Lebanon and Leadership Berks programs. He Worked in the corporate world for a time as a Project Manager for Strategic Development for a major Pharmaceutical Distributor, working with leaders of the company to determine the future and direction of the company.

Easter Hop at Jarrettown UMC

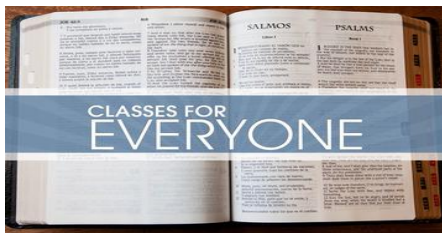
Sunday, March 28 (Rain Date - Saturday, April 3)

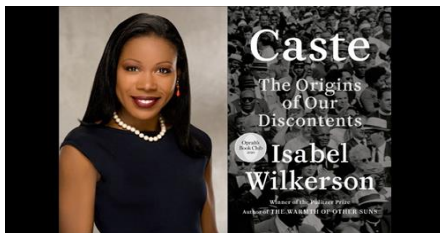
Conversations on Race

Covid-19 Impact Fund Is Making a Difference

Sometimes, simply making a difference is all that's needed. The Covid-19 Impact Fund has been doing just that! Reaching about \$15,000 at its start, we've distributed over \$5,200 to pay 10

rents, make 1 car repair, buy 1 bundle of groceries, help one person get current with their electric bill, help one person get current with their health insurance premiums, and partner with another UMC to provide Christmas presents for 2 families. We are working with several churches in the borough as well as Manna on Main to share the interviewing of those in need and the cost associated with helping. It's been a rewarding experience. In addition to the congregational and

community care, we've also paid to buy PPE to return to worship safely at the right time, and pay for costs associated with the LiveStream broadcasts on Sunday mornings.

UPDATED! – COVID-19 STATUS – NEW!

Cases Slowly Decline!

On Monday, March 1st, Montco's rate of new coronavirus cases fell to 109 per 100,000 residents, an overall decline of 16% over the last 14 days. The downtick is good news. Though hospitalizations are down, the number of deaths is still significant. The test positivity rate declined to 6%, still slightly higher than the recommended minimum rate of 5%. At this level, the county is still listed at *very high risk* based on per capita cases and test positivity according to Commonwealth and Montco health authorities. Caution is still the best response. While we're inching closer to a limited return to in-person worship, LUMC will remain in its current status of restricted opening for LiveStream worship and other approved uses. The numbers are moving in the right direction! Vaccinations will help us!
