### It's the Third Sunday of Easter on April 18!

Christ is risen! The Third Sunday is known as *Jubilant Sunday*. The traditional Gospel reading for the day focuses on the unlikely joyful response to Jesus' revelation to his apostles in John 16 that he will be leaving them to return to the Father. He tells

them not to despair as the Father will send an Advocate (the Holy Spirit) in his place. He, too, will return in resurrection glory, and the apostles will see him alive! His "aliveness" isn't zombie-like, nor is he one among the "walking dead." Jesus' resurrection is a "new thing," a "new creation," a "completion of creation." We'll explore this theme: A resurrection body! What's it mean? Is there a contemporary meaning that may excite new believers? Is there a new theory of physics? A quantum mechanical miracle? Or is it God's completion of the Original Creation? God's high regard for the human body is beyond question in the Apostles' Creed. In our hearts, we're to believe in the body's resurrection. This affirmation suggests that we'll one day be with God in bodies that have recognizable forms. The treatment of the human body with dignity and respect is also beyond question. Jesus greets strangers on the road to Emmaus, the resurrection Lord. They recognize him in the breaking of the bread, the symbol of his body. And they believe! **Church Finances Looking Up...!** -- In more ways than one, church finances are looking up. Looking up to Christ and his church's mission (to make disciples for Jesus Christ through the world's transformation) has inspired tremendously generous giving during the pandemic emergency. "Thank you!" seems inadequate to the colossal endeavor, but the gratitude expressed to all our givers is genuine and heartfelt.

Steady giving kept our ark afloat on the choppy sea of uncertainty. Givers stuck with the church by expressing their consistent commitment to funding missions, relief funds, and the church treasury. New givers (non-members) who connect with the online LiveStream community have given steadily and faithfully.


Year-end into first-quarter new year giving is looking up! In round numbers, \$96,000 was received, and \$92,000 was disbursed in the first quarter. Cash on hand tops \$55,000. The satisfaction of reporting these figures nearly led Warren and Darren to perform a Zoom Chicken Dance at the recent Finance Committee meeting! When these two dedicated servants are optimistic, it's time to praise the Lord. Their careful monitoring of finances is a vital gift to the church. A majority of envelope holders are giving to the operating and improvement funds. Electronic giving is increasing and helps to keep cash flow healthy, which is critical to every non-profit organization, including the church. This year's pledges cover 51% of the budget, which is another indication of things looking up!

The Covid-19 Impact Fund is looking up! An initial anonymous gift last year of \$10,000 helped us establish the fund and grow it by \$13,000 more. So far, the fund has

disbursed more than \$9,000 to soften the economic impact of Covid-19 for church and community people. It's paid rents and utility bills, fixed cars, purchased medicine, and fed people. Two government stimulus checks and extended unemployment benefits have helped many Americans, but for the short-term only. Sometime soon, back rents and delayed payments will come due, and people will need more help. Let's keep funding the help!

### Formal Consensus Training Set for May 2nd & 16th! --

The Southern Montgomery County (SOMOCO) Mission Link of the East District of the UMC plans two training sessions on the decision-making method called "Formal Consensus." The training is prompted by important decisions that UM

churches will make following the next General Conference. The UMC is in organizational flux about the authority of Scripture, the place of the LGBT+ community in the church's life, and how we understand the church's core mission. It's quite likely that all UMC local churches will face a decision about joining one of several new denominations that'll spin-off from the UMC. How will the decisions be made? Up or down voting? Win-lose voting? Or consensus voting to arrive at a peaceable decision? Jess Umlauf, a colleague of Pastor Bill's, will facilitate the training. Here are Jess' descriptions of the two sessions:

"Formal Consensus is a peaceful group decision-making process that aims at weaving everyone's best ideas and key concerns, often resulting in surprising and more creative solutions. It is neither compromise nor voting. In the first training session, an introduction to Formal Consensus, you'll understand the basic dynamics which drive group decision-making and learn the foundations, process, and proposal structure critical to successful use of Formal Consensus."

"After gaining an understanding of the basic structure and foundation of Formal Consensus in session one, the second session will help you learn about creating additional shared values and guiding principles for decision-making, learn the roles to play and to set agendas, understanding and reviewing impediments to Formal Consensus, and practice examples of group discussion techniques."

With the training in hand, local churches stand a better than fair chance at making important decisions about their futures with a lot less mess! **All Church Council members will find this material helpful. Everyone can learn these skills for their personal and professional lives as well. Information about accessing the Zoom sessions is forthcoming. 

#### **Covid-19 Impact Fund Is Making a Difference**

Sometimes, simply making a difference is all that's needed. The Covid-19 Impact Fund has been doing just that! Reaching about \$15,000 at its start, we've distributed over \$5,200 to pay 10 rents, make 1 car

repair, buy 1 bundle of groceries, help one person get current with their electric bill,

help one person get current with their health insurance premiums, and partner with another UMC to provide Christmas presents for 2 families. We are working with several churches in the borough as well as Manna on Main to share the interviewing of those in need and the cost associated with helping. It's been a rewarding experience. In addition to the congregational and community care, we've also paid to buy PPE to return to worship safely at the right time, and pay for costs associated with the LiveStream broadcasts on Sunday mornings.

**UPDATED! – COVID-19 STATUS – NEW!**

**Caution and Optimism!**

Currently, Montco's case count is escalating, which is not the best news. The British variant of Covid-19 is in the county. At current case levels, the county remains in the **very high risk** category according to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and Montgomery County health authorities. The test positivity rate has risen to **8%**, which suggests that the virus isn't under control and that cases are undercounted. Vaccinations are proceeding, which is great news. Vaccinations will get us back to in-person worship in the quickest way. Please consider prayerfully receiving one of the very safe and effective vaccines. For the time being, caution is the wisest course of action. LUMC will remain in its current status of limited openings for LiveStream worship and other approved uses. Let your prayers flow for the many who are suffering and have died, and for the many who grieve and mourn.
