## Note from the Pastor

Many of us have a GPS in our car or on our phone that we use to get directions. A lot of people use their GPS to guide them, turn by turn, to their destination. I still remember purchasing my very first GPS for my car way back in 2008 after seeing someone else using a GPS in their car. You simply type the address you want then press “go” and the GPS will give you instant directions. Sometimes it will give you multiple routes to choose from. They are modern day miracles.



But traveling isn't always smooth or predictable. Sometimes we mess up the GPS when we take a wrong turn whether by accident or on purpose. Sometimes we find ourselves stuck in a long line of traffic because of an unexpected accident or road construction. That's when the GPS does something purely amazing. It will say, "Recalculating..." The GPS looks for alternative routes. The destination remains the same but the GPS helps us discover other routes to get to our destination. Some of those routes can become pretty involved as the GPS takes us through back roads and through places we've never been before. Sometimes it takes us longer than we expected to get there. But the GPS does the best it can to get us to the destination we requested.

Our relationship with God is similar to our relationship with our GPS. We trust the GPS even when it takes us through places that are unfamiliar. Are we willing to follow and trust God when God leads us through those unfamiliar places in life? Sometimes the GPS has to recalculate how we get to our destination. God often recalculates when leading us through times of transition, change, or difficulty.

One of the differences between God and the GPS is that sometimes God also changes the destination. God moves us in a new and different direction than we had anticipated. God helps us grow in ways we may not have imagined.



A recent news article shared that the Montgomeryville Mall, like many malls, is in foreclosure. Malls were once a social icon in our culture and society. The world has changed. Online shopping has moved from being a niche experience to a common occurrence. And malls, department stores, and more are closing across the country. And online shopping is booming. People are still shopping but they are shopping in different ways today. Jeff Bezos, founder of Amazon.com, said "Amazon is not too big to fail... In fact, I predict one day Amazon will fail." Even Bezos recognizes that the world and people's desires change so that even a huge success like Amazon will also one day fail to meet the needs of people. Today, malls are recalculating, repurposing themselves as they compete with Amazon and people's changing attitudes, by offering space for health clinics, areas where people can live, and other experiences beyond the retail shops and restaurant only version of the past.

Churches around the country are struggling today. People's attitudes toward church have changed dramatically over the years. We are still in the business of sharing God's love in and through Jesus Christ but how we do that and accomplish this mission continues to evolve.

Lansdale UMC has faced some difficult challenges over the past couple of years. There has been pain and feelings of loss. And at the same time, God is opening new doors of opportunity if we will only keep our eyes open and be willing to take the risk and walk through these new doors.

Times are scary and challenging for churches and many other institutions in today's crisis filled and radically changing world. Yet God is still Emmanuel, with us, just as God was with those first disciples, followers of Jesus. I don't have all the answers about how God will transform us. I am trusting that God is leading us and together we'll follow where God leads and discover new ministry opportunities. It will be a scary road at times. There will be discomfort and resistance. And we will regularly hear God say, "recalculating" as we follow where God leads. Yet the promise is that we can move beyond our fears and apprehensions to a new place when we open ourselves to God's Holy Spirit who is leading us.

## LUMC Covid-19 response update

The Montgomery County Commissioners in consultation with the Office of Public Health (OPH) announced that starting Monday, August 16, 2021, masking is now recommended indoors for the general public. Montgomery County is also requiring masks for all staff and visitors to all county buildings and facilities. 



## Faith-Sharing event to feature Impact-full pastor

The Rev. Olu Brown, founding pastor of one of the UMC's fastest-growing churches will keynote the Eastern PA Conference's 2021 Faith-Sharing evangelism seminar Oct. 23, at 9 AM to 12 Noon via Zoom. This training meets the evangelism course requirement for clergy, and provides CEUs.

Brown leads [Impact Church](#), in East Point, Ga., part of Metropolitan Atlanta. His vision and leadership has taken the multicultural church from 25 people at its birth in 2007, to more than 5,000 worshipers online now, with 62 staff and a \$4 million budget.

Brown will teach about "Rethinking evangelism and connecting in innovative ways with people and communities to share the love of Christ. Learn how to rethink your evangelism model by embracing the world, using technology and pursuing the Great Commission with a grassroots approach."

He has developed at "Impact Church DCD," *Doing Church Differently™* a model that "redefines the church experience through inclusiveness, relatable messages, energetic weekly gatherings, unique events and activities, relevant youth programs and community outreach...to offer healing, justice and compassion to the world."

[Olu Brown](#), an author and podcast host, announced in May that he will retire from active pastoral ministry in June 2022. He may then focus more on using his gifts as an author, coach, consultant and speaker to help "empower people and organizations to optimize every moment as they strive to Normalize Next."
