Altar Display for Lent

Here is the explanation of the meaning behind the items in the display. A Lenten display has been arranged on the wooden altar table. The display will be added to as Lent progresses. Each item has been chosen to help visualize Jesus' journey to the cross. We invite you to take a moment before or after the service to silently observe the items on the table and to meditate on what Jesus has done so that we may be free.

This is a list of some of the items which will be on view.

- Blue swirl pitcher from Israel representing expensive perfume and the alabaster jar used to anoint Jesus body before his death
- Branches in various vases to represent wilderness
- Purple fabric flowing out of vases to represent his body being poured out as a sacrifice for our sins
- Rocks to represent a pathway to the cross
- Olive branch representing the Garden of Gethsemane
- Large nail and crown of thorns to represent crucifixion
- Rooster, to represent Peter's denial of Jesus
- Small wooden fish shaped bowl, made from olive wood to represent the disciple's mission to become fishers of men.
