#### **Note from the Pastor**



The 4<sup>th</sup> of July is a day for parades in communities around this country. People take time to celebrate our independence. We are reminded that our country is a place of opportunity for all people and a place for religious and cultural tolerance. We don't always live up to these ideals.

Sometimes we make progress toward making them a reality. Other times we take steps backwards and move further from this reality. Our country has never been perfect. We have and will continue to have growing pains, success, and failures.

I decided to attend a 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade in our area. I couldn't find a parade in Lansdale, so I went to North Wales to see the parade there. I passed a church while walking to the center of town and was intrigued by the sign on the church lawn. It is no longer a church. The church closed some time ago and was purchased by the Borough of North Wales. The building is now being used as a



community center. This reminded me of other churches I've seen over the years that have closed and been turned into community centers or art galleries.



I did a Google search for "churches converted to community centers."
There is a long list of churches across the country that have closed and have been converted into community centers.

Here are a couple of titles that were listed:

- Historic city churches find new life as neighborhood centers
- Sacred spaces: Church buildings repurposed as community hubs
- Let's revive empty churches as vibrant community hubs
- Losing My Religion (But Not the Building)

These churches were once vibrant and active yet for many different reasons, they have closed. I've noticed, from my limited perspective, that many churches that close have become isolated from the communities in which they are located. Church begin to face inward and prioritize those on the inside while insulating themselves from people and needs outside the church. Many people in the community don't even realize these churches exist.

Church congregations face many challenges today. The rapid pace of change presents new and sometimes frustrating challenges and issues for the church today. And, I'm also reminded that the church is not the building itself. We the people, followers of Jesus the Christ, are the church. The church building has always been a tool to help us fulfill our ministry and purpose. Many people begin to worship and care more for the building than they do for our faith in Jesus Christ. Churches get into trouble over time when the building becomes the priority rather than the instrument to help us share the love and grace of Jesus Christ.


### **Boiler Update**
