August Congregational Meeting

Church Council will hold a congregational meeting on Sunday, August 13 at 10:15 AM immediately following worship to consider a redistribution of funds to help us meet ministry expenses. Council will propose a plan to move funds from three different areas to meet ministry expenses.

\$15,057 from balance remaining in the Covid-19Impact Fund\$4,000 from the Library fund\$1,700 from the Living Water Service fund\$20,757 Total (estimated amount)

Monthly expenses tend to be around \$26,000 each month. Total monthly income is around \$18-19,000 per month. We typically make up income shortfalls around Easter and in December of each year around Christmas.

Church Council wants to move the above funds into the budget to meet ministry expenses. The August meeting is an attempt to be transparent and to test the will of the congregation around taking these steps. Please plan to attend the August 13 meeting. Any other second mile giving over and above your regular giving will also be greatly appreciated. Thank you for your faithfulness in giving.



New Boiler

The boiler that provides heat for the church broke down and stopped working several times this past winter leaving the building with no heat. The boiler is more than 30 years old, so many of the parts are no longer available. The Trustees have worked very hard to keep the boiler running and to get it repaired multiple times. The decision was made to replace the boiler. The new boiler will be replaced this August. Parts have been on order and the boiler will be installed this summer before we get to the cold winter months.

Note from the Pastor



How do you measure vitality? That's a question many of us ask as we grow older. Our bodies change and our outlook on life changes with maturity. While at the same time, we admire the energy of youth, the idealism, the

sense of invulnerability. How do we remain vital as we grow and change?

Exercise is an important factor in remaining vital, whether we are young or older. Sitting down and eating junk food decreases our energy and vitality. We need to get up and keep moving. Movement is essential.

Reading, learning new skills and hobbies, are also ways we can continue to be vital. Filling our minds with new experiences and ideas refreshes and renews us. Failure to read and to seek new experiences can leave us stagnant. Our brains also need exercise.

So how do churches remain vital? How do congregations avoid becoming stagnant? I've heard people say that if someone from the 50's travelled to some of our churches, they wouldn't see anything new in some churches who have remained the same even though the world has changed dramatically.

LUMC has entered into a process called Pathways. The EPA website describes this process as, "Pathways to Congregational Fruitfulness & Health offers a menu of intentional processes congregations can use to prepare, assess, learn and grow in their understanding of what it means to be a healthy, fruitful congregation." https://www.epaumc.org/news/stepinto-pathways-now-available-on-epas-website/

Pathways looks at five areas that deal with church vitality.

- 1. Growing a Vital Mission Congregation
- 2. Sustainability
- 3. A Path Toward Wholeness Training and Planning
- 4. Re-Envisioning Space / Property Development
- 5. Conflict Resolution

While each of these areas is important, congregations are asked to choose one area to focus on. Our congregation is focusing on the area, "*Growing a Vital Mission Congregation."* This is our focus and we will also continue to work on the other areas as well.

We had our first meeting with our Pathways facilitator, Rev. Brad Leight, on July 25, 2023. Rev. Leight asked the Pathways team to respond to four questions.

Vitality questions from Pathways

- 1. What are 3-4 strengths or really good things going on at LUMC?
- 2. Think of a ministry or activity that serves either the congregation or the community very well.
- 3. Is there a ministry or a need in the congregation or community that could be done better?
- 4. Do you see any common threads that run through all these that point to opportunities we have to move forward?

We are now asking you as a congregation, new, longterm, visitors, youth, and adults to give us your feedback on these questions. The questions are included on a separate sheet in this newsletter. Please take some time to reflect on and respond to these questions. Please drop off, mail, or email your responses to the church office office@lansdaleumc.org on or before August 21. We will compile the responses and share them with the team and with you as a congregation. Thank you ahead of time for your participation and help with this process.

Prison Ministry Donation

On Thursday July 27, 2023 Pastor Stew and I went to prison. Actually, we went to the Montgomery County Correctional Facility to meet with Chaplain Kevin Bone. Marilyn Schneider, Coordinator for Prison Ministry for EPA Conference has been assisting the Chaplain with funding for various needs. Chaplain Bone is the only Chaplain for the approximately 900 inmates and does not have a budget to purchase items such as Bibles or self-help books. He had reached out to Marilyn Schneider regarding purchasing books titled **Experiences of Grief** which deals with the loss of loved ones. Pastor Stew purchased copies of this book, which we delivered during our visit.

We learned that inmates are given items such as a small bar of soap, tube of toothpaste, and one pair of underwear when entering the facility and must purchase additional items through the commissary, where prices are relatively expensive. Marilyn informed us that they are promoting a program (see https://www.epaumc.org/news/epa-prison-ministry-launches-toiletry-bowl-donation-campaign/). As an example, **six** 6 ounce tubes of toothpaste can be purchased for \$9.94 (At the commissary **one** 6 ounce tube ranges from \$3.27 to \$6.62 as of October 2022). This program is not connected to our support for Liberty Ministries, but if you desire to support this ministry you can do so through the above link.

Chaplain Bone and Marilyn Schneider also praised Liberty Ministries for the good work that they do for inmates at the prison and after their release. Liberty Ministries also coordinates volunteer activities at the Montgomery County Correctional Facility. If anyone has a desire to get involved in prison ministries, Liberty Ministries, Marilyn Schneider, or Chaplain Bone could provide further information.

Help Needed to House Homeless Families in September

Lansdale UMC will be working with Inter-Faith Housing Alliance, or as we know it, Family Promise, to house (up to) three homeless families in our building during the month of September (8/29 - 9/30). This is a wonderful opportunity for outreach for our congregation.

Since we last hosted in November the food program has been changed to only include meals for the families on Monday, Wednesdays and Fridays. The families will be able to use other resources for the remaining days' food needs. We will gladly accept gift cards for meals and/or gas for the families as a way to participate in this mission as well.

Drivers *may* be needed to transport the families to and from the day facility in Ambler. At this time, the families all have their own transportation, but this may change at any time during the month. We will need to have volunteers ready if the need for drivers becomes necessary.

The Blue Envelope for August will support Liberty Ministries. Liberty Ministries was established in 1980 to serve the inmate populations of Montgomery County Correctional Facility and the State Correctional Institution at Graterford. Since that time, Liberty Ministries has positively impacted thousands of men and women inmates and ex-inmates with the teaching of the Word of God, spiritual, physical and emotional support, and the life changing power of Jesus Christ. Today Liberty Ministries maintains Liberty House, a dormitory style residence for men, recently released from prison, who enroll in a twelve month educational and discipleship program. Over 160 volunteers visit men and women in prison on a monthly basis teaching, training, mentoring, and preparing men and women for life outside of prison. Liberty Ministries also maintains five thrift stores which offer excellent values to our customers, while providing financial support for the ministry.

"Liberty Ministries exists to serve offenders in prison and ex-offenders in the community by showing God's love, providing practical assistance and supporting biblical standards of justice."

Sadly, over 65% of those who go to prison will return within a year or two because nothing has really changed for the good. Most prisoners receive minimal assistance for their addictions, counseling for their wounds, or the vocational assistance that could help them make a positive difference in their lives and the lives of their families.

Liberty Ministries is committed to providing the resources, tools, and training that these men and women need to turn their life around. Working inside the prisons and in our after-care residential facilities, our team of skilled chaplains, counselors and mentors engage these men and women in a variety of ways. From addiction counseling and support groups, to vocational training, to spiritual development, to character-directed therapy, our programs invest into the lives of those stuck in addiction and crime.
