Note from the Pastor

Flying a small drone has become a source of relaxation for me. Flying the drone has also helped me to see landscapes in totally different perspectives. There are several basic "drone moves" that allow me



to see landscapes from differing perspectives. Circling, flying backwards from an object, flying toward an object, moving up or down, and several other perspectives. I'm learning to try each of these perspectives because they each provide a unique and very different view of the same object.

This got me to thinking about the many fights we have between people in our country and other countries. Israelis and Palestinians are deep into a massive conflict resulting in many deaths, especially deaths of innocent children and other civilians. It can be confusing trying to reconcile the opposing views of these two countries.

At the same time, the House of Representatives is stuck in a quagmire of trying to choose a new speaker of the house. So many different perspectives and these varying views have brought the house to a standstill with no leadership in place.

Christians here in our country are struggling with different perspectives. Russell Moore, head of Christianity Today Magazine, shares his frustration with Christians who see Jesus as too weak. So there are people in churches who are criticizing pastors for talking too much about Jesus simply because Jesus' life and teachings differs from their understanding of the world and relationships.

Even Jesus had to deal with different perspectives. Jesus and the religious leaders who opposed him both believed in the same scriptures and the same God. Yet they had radically different understandings about the message of these scriptures, who God is, and how we are to relate to each other.

I can see how it might be so much easier if there were just one way of viewing and understanding life. It would be simpler if one perspective were correct, and all others were wrong. But that isn't how God made us. God made us to be in relationship with each other. And relationships are rarely simple, and they can be and are often messy.

Maybe that's why Jesus told us the greatest two commandments are to love God and to love our neighbor. God's love cuts through the messiness of life. God's love moves us beyond forcing people to choose which person's way is better. God's love teaches us to focus on relationships, seeking to understand, treating each other with compassion, working together to help meet needs in our community and world, and more.

Relationships, like drones, help us to see things from differing perspectives. Each relationship gives us a new perspective that may be different from our own personal experience. There is wonder and surprise when we allow ourselves to see and experience these different perspectives. This article won't change many minds about who's right and who's wrong. But maybe, just maybe, it might cause one or two people to listen and seek to understand a perspective and way of seeing that differs from them. And maybe we can hear Jesus' challenge to a world so full of hatred to love God and to love our neighbor. Maybe...

Missions

November Mission Emphasis

Guided by Jesus Christ, Red Bird Mission is located in the Appalachian mountains of Southeastern Kentucky. Red Bird empowers individuals and advocates for justice by providing educational, health and community outreach ministries to an area of low-income residents. It has served this area since 1921. This isolated, rural distressed area has chronic poverty, a lack of jobs, poor housing and rugged mountainous terrain, which presents many obstacles to a fuller life of its residence. A PreK-12 school provides education ministries in a loving Christian environment, Health & Wellness ministries through medical and dental clinics, and home care services.

Red Bird has a Work Camp where VIM Volunteers help refurbish homes, a community store with low-cost clothing and furniture, a craft ministries (market local crafter items to a wide area). Support for these ministries come from churches and individuals across the nation. There has been a decline in support and they are facing a financial crisis to continue some ministries.
