Note from the Pastor

People have always shopped but how and where they shop constantly changes. There have been numerous stories about the decline of malls and department stores. I remember

seeing an article with pictures of abandoned malls that were falling apart and covered with vegetation. JC Penney and Sears used to be a staple of American society and now they are symbols of a time that used to be. And just recently news reports have come out about Macy's closing 150 stores. That's about 1/3 of all their stores.

Is Macy's closing stores because people no longer shop? No, people continue to shop but they now shop differently and in different places. Department stores are struggling to keep pace with big box retailers and online shopping. People can often find one stop shopping where they can get every thing they're looking for either at the big box stores or by shopping online. I've been amazed lately that I can order an item online and receive it on my doorstep the next day. No crowds, I don't have to drive somewhere, no standing in line at a cash register, no automated machines to mess around with, I simply click a few buttons on my computer and the product arrives the next day.

I wonder if church is similar to what's happening with malls and department stores. I don't think people have stopped seeking God and cultivating their spiritual lives and relationships with others. But the way people do this has changed. And the change isn't recent.

Abraham, the father of the Jews, Christians, and Muslims, didn't attend a synagogue, church or mosque. He and his family worshipped God at home. The Hebrew people who were freed from slavery in Egypt worshipped God via a portable Tabernacle that could be assembled and disassembled as they traveled through the wilderness. King David and his son Solomon built a temple in Jerusalem where people could come and worship God. The Babylonians destroyed the temple in Jerusalem and took people into exile outside their home country. So the people developed local synagogues where people could worship, hear the scriptures, and grow in their faith. The early Christian church didn't have a build or a temple. So people

gathered in homes to pray, read scripture, and have fellowship. The church began to construct buildings and cathedrals over the years where Christians have worshipped God. There are modern day Christians who have made the conscience decision to not have a building as they return to worshipping in homes or in mission sites.

There is a lot of talk today about the thousands of churches of many different denominations that close each year. Our own United Methodist EPA conference has closed churches almost every year recently. People talk about how to save the church. Kind of like people talk about saving department stores and malls. People still have a spiritual hunger for God even today. And every generation finds and develops ways to help connect God with people.

Jesus didn't use a building to connect with people. Jesus developed relationships with people. Jesus traveled from town to town to reach and connect with people. Jesus' focus was on helping people build a vital relationship with God and with each other.

This isn't the same world it was 50, 100, or even 1,000 years ago. Yet God continues to reach out and connect with us even while times change. Let's remember this Lent and Easter season the message of God's grace in Jesus Christ transforming us and the world even in the midst of new challenges and opportunities.


Thank You

Lent | Easter Altar Display

This Lenten display will be added to as Lent progresses. Each item has been chosen to help visualize Jesus' journey to the cross. We invite you to take a moment before or after the service to silently observe the items on the table and to meditate on what Jesus has done so that we may be free. This is a list of some of the items which will be on view.

- Blue swirl pitcher from Israel representing expensive perfume and the alabaster jar used to anoint Jesus body before his death.
- Branches in various vases to represent wilderness.
- Purple fabric flowing out of vases to represent his body being poured out as a sacrifice for our sins.
- Stones to represent a pathway to the cross
- Olive branch representing the Garden of Gethsemane
- Large nail and Crown of Thorns to represent crucifixion.
- Rooster, to represent Peter's denial of Jesus.
- Small wooden fish shaped bowl, made from olive wood, to represent the disciples mission to become fishers of men
- Chalice made from olive wood, represents the Last Supper Jesus shared with his disciples.
