Who we are as a United Methodist Church

By the time you read this, the General Conference will be over and our Annual Conference delegates will be heading to Wildwood, NJ, for the yearly session of our EPA Annual Conference which will run from Tuesday, May 21 to Thursday, May 23.

What is the General Conference?

The General Conference, the primary legislative body of The United Methodist Church, is the only body that speaks officially for the church Meeting once every four years to determine legislation affecting connectional matters, it is composed of no fewer than 600 and no more than 1,000 delegates.

Working within the boundaries of the Church Constitution and General rules, the General Conference defines and fixes the conditions, privileges, and duties of church membership; the powers and duties of elders, deacons, diaconal ministers and local pastors; and the powers and duties of annual conferences, missionary conferences, charge conferences, and congregational meetings. It authorizes the organization, promotion and administrative work of the church. The General Conference also defines the powers and duties of the episcopacy; authorizes the official hymnal and book of worship, provides a judicial system and procedures, initiates and directs all connectional enterprises of the church and enacts other legislation for the operation of the church.

Note from the Pastor

Transformation isn't a dirty word. God is constantly working with and within us to bring about transformation. We experience transformation in many places. Electrical grids

have transformers to boast the electrical signals to reach homes further away. Batteries transform chemicals into energy that we use to power all kinds of gadgets and electronics in our lives. Transforming is a process of changing chemicals into energy.

Transformation also happens in nature and is maybe most evident in the process of a caterpillar transforming into a butterfly as is illustrated in this picture. Caterpillars are often seen as destructive nuisances that eat leaves on trees and other plants. Butterflies are often admired for their beauty. But every butterfly was once an ugly caterpillar.

Imagine God's transformation process for us. Many of us don't want to be transformed. We often view transformation as a sign that we aren't good enough or that something is wrong with us. What would be different if we understood transformation as a natural process in both our physical, mental, and spiritual lives? What if we welcomed transformation rather than run from it?

The sermons through May and the first part of June will be exploring God's transforming process in our lives. We'll look at various scriptures and Bible characters to understand the in's and out's of how God works to help us grow in faith. We'll recognize that transformation almost never is easy or smooth. Transformation often involves letting go, pain that comes with growth and dealing with failure, and often times changing directions. Yet, the joys and benefits of transformation are numerous. After all Jesus transformed death on the cross into the resurrection and new life. Remember, God wants to bring new life transformation into each of our lives.

A small group of persons met with Family Promise at the end of April to discuss housing homeless people here at LUMC for the third year in September. There was a lot of discussion and a desire to be supportive and helpful. The group has decided to offer to help another church rather than house families here at LUMC. What is the Annual Conference?

The annual conference is a geographical region*
(comprising districts), an organizational body (made up of elected lay and clergy members), and a yearly meeting. Annual conferences approve programming and budget, elect delegates to General and Jurisdictional conferences, and examine and recommend candidates for ministry. The annual conference is composed of clergy and lay members elected by each charge, diaconal ministers, conference presidents of United Women of Faith and United Methodist Men, conference and district lay leaders and presidents of young adult and youth organizations.
